3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT -A

John's disciples, probably with some hesitation, told him that Jesus made no mention of the "coming wrath." Nor was there anything about rescuing John from prison. Instead, he talked about the blind, the lame, lepers, the deaf, the dead, and about poor people getting good news. Jesus, realizing that his message might not fit John's expectation, added the remark about the blessedness of the one who hears his words, and does not lose trust in him.

We may find ourselves in situations of violence, suffering and confusion; and we too will have expectations of how God will intervene. Isn't our expectation that God's presence will be some manifestation of superior power to make things right? Jesus realized that only the humble power of God's love can vanquish the reign of evil and bring about a new kingdom of justice and peace. Love must actualize itself in defending and promoting the God-given rights of every human being—the fundamental right to live and the right to participate with dignity in the life of the community. Love, which seems most weak, most impractical, most foolish in the face of evil, is the only force that can change the human heart.

Only if we are able, like John, to be freed of our own expectations, will we be able to welcome the coming of the Lord and his way of love. Then we, also like John, may prepare the way for others to welcome the Lord's coming. -Campion P. Gavaler, O.S.B.

REQUIREMENTS TO BE A SPONSOR FOR BAPTISM OR CONFIRMATION

The sponsor (or godparent) needs to supply a sponsor certificate from his/her parish to our parish where the Baptism or Confirmation will be celebrated OR a copy of the sponsor/godparent's Confirmation certificate.

Canon Law requires the sponsor/godparent:

- To be a participating member of the Catholic Church
- To be at least 16 years of age
- To have received the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation
- If married should be married by the laws of the Catholic Church
- Is an active member of the parish

REFLECTION

After confirming who he is, Jesus goes on to confirm who John the Baptist is. He is the one sent to prepare the way for the Messiah. His rhetorical question, "what did you go out to see...." points out that there were those who were expecting a Messiah who would be high class, wealthy and a political leader. Jesus shows us that this is certainly not God's plan for the Redeemer. John the Baptist, in preparing the way for Jesus, does so in the same simple and humble manner as Jesus himself would do. There were those who were surprised, disappointed and unable to accept the thought that the Messiah would be a poor carpenter from an insignificant village who was very comfortable associating with tax collectors and sinners.

As the ministry of Jesus continues and his identity becomes clearer, it is incomprehensibly for many to believe that the Messiah was also the Son of God – The word made Flesh. Why would almighty God humble himself to become a frail man? Very simply, because; "God so loved the world that he sent his only begotten Son...." Jn 3:16 - Father Killian Loch, O.S.B
