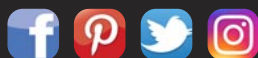

Day 1 Monday, June 26: Depart for Italy

Depart Newark Liberty International Airport on the overnight flight to Rome, Italy. Complimentary dinner (D), breakfast (B), and beverages will be served in flight.

Day 2 Tuesday, June 27: Welcome to Rome!

Arrival at Rome's Leonardo Da Vinci Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim our luggage, and meet our Peter's Way Tour Manager in the Arrivals Hall. Board our private touring bus and we will be on our way to Trastevere, one of Rome's most colorful areas and often referred to as a "real Roman neighborhood." **Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of Santa Cecilia in Trastevere.** Tradition holds that a simple shrine was built over the house of St. Cecilia, patron saint of musicians, in the second half of the fourth century. Under Pope St. Paschal I, a basilica replaced this to serve as a more fitting place for the remains of the saint and her companions, which were then transferred from the catacombs of St. Callistus. The baptistery associated with this church, together with the remains of a Roman house of the early Empire, were found during some excavations under the Chapel of the Relics. Time will be given for an independent lunch with free time in Trastevere, a charming neighborhood with many shops and cafés.

Mid-afternoon, we'll check-in at our hotel and enjoy the balance of the day at leisure. You might wish to shop for religious articles to be blessed by the Holy Father at tomorrow's General Audience.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Rome.

Day 3 Wednesday, June 28: Papal Audience | Basilicas of Rome

Breakfast at our hotel. After an early breakfast, **enter the heart of Christendom for an audience with our Holy Father. Pope Francis will greet all the pilgrims present, deliver his message to the faithful, pray the Pater Noster, and bless religious articles.** Independent lunch.

Continue our day with a visit to the Basilica of St. Mary Major. We'll have a guided tour of one of the four major basilicas built by Pope Sixtus III (AD 432-440). Take in the impressive interior with its remarkable mosaics in the nave that depict scenes from the Old Testament. The mosaics above the entablature are among the most ancient Christian mosaics in Rome. Pray near the relic of Christ's manger, which came to Rome when Saint Jerome's body was brought to the church from Bethlehem. **Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of St. Mary Major.** Continue to the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran. Dedicated to St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist, it was founded by the Emperor Constantine in the 4th century and was home to popes for many years prior to the present Vatican residence. End our tour with a visit to the Basilica of Santa Croce, one of the Seven Pilgrim Churches of Rome where relics of the Passion are preserved.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Rome.

Day 4 Thursday, June 29: Papal Mass on the Solemnity of Saints

Peter and Paul | Imperial Rome

After an early breakfast at our hotel, **we'll be transferred to St. Peter's Basilica to attend the Papal Mass on the Solemnity of Ss. Peter & Paul, celebrated by His Holiness, Pope Francis.** Independent lunch.

This afternoon, enjoy a guided walking tour of historic Rome, beginning at the Spanish Steps (Piazza di Spagna). Continue to the Trevi Fountain to toss in a coin and then visit the Pantheon. Built more than 1800 years ago, the magnificent Pantheon still stands as a reminder of the great Roman Empire. Visit the nearby Church of St. Louis of the French to see three magnificent paintings by Baroque master Caravaggio: *Martyrdom of St. Matthew*, *Calling of St. Matthew*, and *St. Matthew and the Angel*. Our walking tour will conclude in the lively Piazza Navona, one of the most charming and popular squares in Rome. Time will be given to browse through the artists' stalls or relax and enjoy one of Rome's most famous frozen treats, Tartufo at the Gelateria Tre Scalini. The gelato is delicious too! Independent dinner.

Overnight at our hotel in Rome.

Day 5 Friday, June 30: Vatican Museums, Sistine Chapel, & St.

Peter's Basilica | St. Paul Outside-the-Walls | Catacombs | Farewell to Rome Dinner

After an early breakfast at our hotel, **transfer to St. Peter's Basilica to celebrate Mass at the Tomb of St. Peter (subject to confirmation) or one of the Grotto Chapels.** After Mass, visit one of the great art collections in the world, the Vatican Museums. Walk in the footsteps of the Princes of the Church through the richly decorated galleries. See the Sistine Chapel and contemplate the frescoes of numerous Renaissance masters and the inspired ceiling of Michelangelo. End our morning tour in St. Peter's Basilica. Take in the awesome architecture and the statuary adorning this largest of all Christian churches, including Michelangelo's magnificent "Pieta." Pray at the new tomb of St. John Paul II in St. Sebastian's Chapel. If time permits, you may wish to go to the Vatican Crypt to see and pray near the tomb of St. Peter. Independent lunch.

This afternoon, visit the magnificent Papal Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls, built by Constantine in the 4th century on the site of St. Paul's tomb. After being totally destroyed by fire in 1823, it was rebuilt on the original basilican plan of early Christian churches. Surrounding the nave are the medallions of each Pope, from Peter to Francis. Continue

along the Ancient Appian Way, seeing the huge slabs that originally paved its length and several surviving Patrician tombs, including the massive tomb of Cecilia Metella. Visit the Catacombs of St. Sebastian and the Basilica of St. Sebastian Outside the Walls. Walk through the maze of tunnels where early Christians secretly practiced religious rites and buried their dead.

Our farewell to Rome dinner this evening will be at a local restaurant. Experience an atmosphere of hospitality and taste the Mediterranean cuisine in a typical Roman setting with wine and music.

Overnight at our hotel in Rome.

Day 6 Saturday, July 1: Assisi | Florence

Breakfast at our hotel. Then, depart Rome for Assisi, a highpoint of our travel experience. After a 2.5-hour ride, we will see Assisi on a mountaintop, with its narrow lanes, shrines of St. Francis, and overwhelming art dedicated to its young friar, a rich young man who turned to God after an illness and established an order that has grown stronger over the centuries. **Arrive in time for 11:00 a.m. Mass at the Basilica of St. Francis.** After Mass, our local guide will take us to explore the Basilica complex, which is composed of two churches built one atop the other. Beneath both churches is the crypt that houses the tomb of St. Francis. The lower basilica is richly decorated with beautiful stained glass windows and paintings by important artists of the 13th and 14th centuries. In the upper basilica, we will marvel at monumental frescoes, painted by Giotto, depicting scenes from the life of St. Francis. Continue to visit the Basilica of St. Clare. View the remains of the first and most important heroine of the Franciscan movement, and see the miraculous Crucifix. Group lunch at a restaurant in Assisi.

After lunch, we'll visit the Basilica of Santa Maria degli Angeli, a great basilica built in 1569 and crowned by Alessi's magnificent dome. It encloses the shrine of the "Porziuncula," or the Little Portion Chapel, around which the first Franciscan community was centered; the place where Clare received the habit from Francis; and the Capella Del Transito, which marks the spot where St. Francis died. We will see the statue of St. Francis in the courtyard where thornless roses bloom. Then, we'll continue through the gentle Umbrian and Tuscan hills to the Renaissance city of Florence for hotel check-in. Independent dinner. Overnight at our hotel in Florence.

Day 7 Sunday, July 2: Highlights of Florence

Breakfast at our hotel. **Begin our day with Sunday Mass at the Church of St. Mark or the Basilica of Santa Maria Novella.** After Mass, our local guide will take us to visit the Accademia, which holds the superb "David" by Michelangelo. Continue to visit the beautiful Piazza Del Duomo and the delicately patterned green, white, and pink Cathedral of Santa Maria Del Fiore, crowned with Brunelleschi's magnificent dome. See Giotto's Bell Tower; the Romanesque Baptistery of St. John with the exquisite bronze doors by Ghiberti, which Michelangelo called the "Gates of Paradise"; and the 13th century Franciscan Church of the Holy Cross, which holds the tombs of the greatest of Florentine men. Independent lunch.

Free afternoon to explore Florence on your own. Perhaps you'll visit the Uffizi Palace, which houses what may be the most important collection of paintings in the world. Or visit the Piazza Della Signoria; the famous shop-lined bridge, Ponte Vecchio; and the adjacent market to shop for leather, gold, or other Florentine souvenirs.

Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Florence.

Day 8 Monday, July 3: Padua | Mestre

Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we'll leave Florence and drive north through the Apennine Mountains to the town of Padua. Here we'll visit the Basilica of St. Anthony with its famous Chapel of the Relics, which contain the actual tongue and lower jawbone of the saint. The basilica also contains a mixture of Gothic, Romanesque, and Byzantine architecture and holds a huge collection of art treasures. **Celebrate Mass, followed by prayer and reflection at the Shrine of St. Anthony.** Independent lunch.

This afternoon, we will visit Giotto's Scrovegni Chapel (*subject to confirmation*). Built by Enrico Scrovegni in 1303, it is considered the most important building in the charming city of Padua. The newly restored frescoed interior is Giotto's magnificent depiction of the Life of Christ, the Virgin Mary, and the Last Judgment. These frescoes are considered his highest achievement. Check-in at our hotel in Mestre outside Venice. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Mestre.

Day 9 Tuesday, July 4: Highlights of Venice

Breakfast at our hotel. This morning, we will be transferred to the pier and take a motorboat to St. Mark's Square to explore this lovely and famous lagoon city on the Adriatic Coast. Venice is like a giant maze, with its tiny alleys and hidden piazzas linked by narrow footbridges over the many large and small canals. **Celebrate Mass at St. Mark's Basilica.** After Mass, we'll have a walking tour of Venice's hub of activity, Piazza San Marco, which is lined with galleries, luxury shops, and charming cafes. Dominating the square is the magnificent Basilica San Marco, where the mixture of styles—Byzantine, Romanesque, and Gothic—and profuse decoration reflect Venice's history. Marvel at the shimmering mosaics encrusted on its interior walls, the precious sculptures, and rare marbles. Admire the Campanile, having simple lines contrasting sharply with the sumptuous decor of the church and clock tower, where famous Moors have been striking the hours for over 500 years. Continue to the Bridge of Sighs, which connects to the Doge's Palace and the Piombi Prisons. Continue to Chiesa di San Zaccaria, a 15th century monastic church dedicated to St. Zachariah, the father of John the Baptist. One highlight will be viewing Giovanni Bellini's altarpiece, *Madonna and Four Saints*.

Independent lunch. Free afternoon to explore Venice on your own. You may enjoy a gondola trip, gliding along the picturesque canals as a local troubadour serenades you. Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Mestre.

Day 10 Wednesday, July 5: Return to the USA

Breakfast at our hotel. After breakfast, transfer to Venice Airport for the return flight to Newark Liberty International Airport. Arrive on the same day.

LATE RESERVATIONS: Enrollments received after the deposit deadline are subject to confirmation. Late fees and a possible increase in airfare may apply.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: Each traveler is solely responsible for carrying a valid passport and ascertaining knowledge of current entry/exit requirements for all countries on this itinerary. **U.S. Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months after the return date.** Special entry requirements for non-U.S. citizens may apply. Please consult the appropriate Consulate for current international travel requirements. Beginning in 2023, visitors to the European Union may require additional travel documents to enter the EU. After enrolling you will be sent information to apply online for ETIAS prior to travel (if required). Each traveler is solely responsible for ensuring that all required travel documents are complete and current. PWT will not be held responsible for a passenger's lack of current and valid entry documents (ie., passport, proof of vaccine, any required test results).

AIR TRANSPORTATION: This travel package includes round-trip economy class airfare from Newark. Flight itinerary and carrier may be subject to change. Estimated departure taxes & fuel surcharges are subject to increase prior to ticketing. If you purchase independent connecting flights, PWT will not be held responsible for the cost(s) if you cancel participation for any reason. **It is important that you do not purchase airline tickets until the group has been confirmed for travel by PWT.**

is customary to leave €1 Euro per person for the wait staff after each meal and €1 Euro per person per day for housekeeping.
